Devon & Cornwall Police

Following the supportive outcome of the Kingston Neighbourhood Plan Referendum (of those who voted, 88% voted in favour and 12% voted against the Plan), we now have confirmation from South Hams District Council that at its meeting on 20 May the plan was "made". The term "made" establishes a requirement on South Hams District Council to take the Plan into account when considering any planning applications in the Parish.

Reaching this final stage follows almost 5 years of painstaking, detailed and challenging hard work but it has been more than worth it to know that Kingston has made clear the terms and policies which will ensure that the vision of our community is realised for the life of the Plan. The Plan will be monitored annually by KPC and must be reviewed by KPC before 20 May 2026 (5 year review) to ensure that it remains consistent with the wishes of the community.

Many, many people in the village and outside, (some of whom have moved on), have made contributions in the last 5 years – small and large – towards getting our Neighbourhood Plan made. You know who you are and KNPTG thanks each and every one of you wholeheartedly.

Thefts of Catalytic Converters - Forcewide

Police appeal for information

Police are appealing for information after a spate of recent catalytic converter thefts across Devon and Cornwall. Between mid-February and mid-April, police have received nine reports of thefts in the Newton Abbot area, the latest being at from a car parked in Trendlebere Down car park, Manaton, during the morning of Monday 19 April. The thefts have been occurring Forcewide including Plymouth, Barnstaple and Exeter, and generally occur during the day.

Police are urging motorists to be vigilant and report any suspicious activity.

Police would also like to hear from anyone who has been approached by someone selling a catalytic converter, and anyone with CCTV which may have captured the people selling them, to help officers identify those responsible. There will be NO morning service in Kingston on May 30th. See next paragraph for details.

During June, the plan is to continue the four services as per our usual schedule for Kingston. It is stressed that "mingling" in church before and after services is to be avoided to help prevent the spread of the Coronavirus. Next Kingston Parish Council Meeting – Thursday 17th June in the Reading Room. The Agenda will be placed on the Parish Website

(www.kingstonparishcouncil.co.uk) and the Parish Noticeboard (situated on the Fire Station wall) on Thursday 10th June 2021. The meeting will commence at 7.30pm. Public are welcome to join the Open Forum which is held at the beginning of each KPC meeting for any questions you may have, and COVID-19 rules will still have to be strictly followed: masks must be worn, people must maintain a minimum 2 metre distance, use the hand sanitizer at the entrance and please use the QR Code.

Refuse Collection and Recycling. Regrettably, no-one in Kingston needs to be told that refuse and recycling collections continue to be problematic (understatement) – not just here but right across the South Hams. As a result, the contractor has paused the roll-out of the new service while they try to fix existing problems. South Hams District Council (SHDC) executive are now meeting the contractor every week to highlight problems and challenge them as to how they are going to solve them; they have also seconded a suitably qualified and experienced member of their own staff to the contractor to help. Furthermore, with effect from the week commencing Monday 24th May, only the smaller recycling trucks are being allocated to the village, but more of them, in order to address both the growing backlog and the underlying problem. Finally, the contractor is reviewing and adjusting the design of the rounds. **The situation is therefore very fluid.** At time of publication we think the whole village might be moving onto a Friday for recycling. Frustratingly, we have asked for clarification but have not yet received it, so unfortunately it is not clear whether this is just the recycling or the black and brown bins too. **Please therefore watch KEG facebook page as this is where we will promulgate more information as soon as we have it.** In the meantime please continue to report any missed collections via <https://www.southhams.gov.uk/report>, within 2 working days of your scheduled collection. Please also continue to inform Suzannah Grant when things go wrong, and thank you to those who have so far; this means we can keep providing SHDC with evidence of problems which helps them put pressure on the contractor to fix them. If you're not sure when to put your bins out, please contact Suzannah on sgrantkpc@gmail.com or 01548 810013.

Kingston Neighbourhood Plan. With Kingston Neighbourhood Plan now made, a ***huge*** thank you from KPC to KNPTG for all their hard work and tenacity over 5 years.

Parking. Although there are no parking restrictions in the village, there is pressure on the limited amount of parking available due to the number of vehicles and properties without off-street parking for all vehicles in the household. The Parish Council have considered introducing restrictions but have discounted this due to the cost, lack of enforcement and the fact that it would just move the problem to other areas in the Parish. Please therefore be considerate when parking your vehicles on the road. The need to park close to your property is recognised but please ***think*** whether a lorry, large agricultural vehicle or even an ambulance or fire engine could get past – if not, you are parking in the wrong place. The Parish Council also intend to contact the National Trust and ask for parking provision due to the increase in people using the “new” permissive path at Scobbiscombe.

Recreation Ground. The recreation ground is looking particularly good at the moment and is ready for the summer. The wild copse by the skate park is coming on well – this is an area where youngsters will be encouraged to play and make dens amongst the trees, using the branches that have been provided. Darren's maze around our oak tree at the entrance has been cut back to allow the wild plants to grow up again so that the younger children can enjoy following the winding path and spotting insects and flowers. The field is cut for games and some ageing playground equipment has been replaced. Unfortunately we are unable to open the zip-wire at the moment – it has had to be taken out of commission as the A-frame is unstable, making it very dangerous to use. We are in the process of applying for grants to cover its repair which will be undertaken as soon as possible. Please check our proposed fundraising events in the village diary.

SeaMoor Lotto. SeaMoor Lotto is an online sustainable fundraising initiative provided by SHDC and West Devon Borough Council, designed to help local not-for-profit organisations and community groups raise money in a safe, fun and effective way. There are over 101 local causes registered, ranging from Scout groups and school PTAs to sports teams and local food banks. There are weekly cash prizes up to the value of a £25,000 jackpot and 50:1 odds of winning a prize. For £1, anyone can buy a “chance” and support the local community. The chosen cause receives 50% of each ticket and an additional 10% goes to a central fund to further support the local community: www.seamoortalotto.co.uk.

Hiring Charges Kingston Reading Room



- Sessions are 8:30am to 1:30pm, 1:30pm to 6:30pm, 6:30pm to 11:30pm. If more time is needed to set up or clear away, then it should be booked.
- Hall users that satisfy the objects of the Reading Room charity Trust deed are charged at £6 per session. They must be non-profit (and may be subject to financial review) and open to all residents of Kingston Parish and be advertised in Kingston as such.
- Private events are charged at £7.50 per hour or part hour, including set up and clean up times.
- Sole occupancy of the Reading Room for a full day is charged at £275.
- Afternoon session children’s parties are charged at a concessionary rate of £10 per session.
- The meeting room is charged at £5 per session.
- Existing agreements will be honoured.
- Bookings are recorded in the Reading Room bookings calendar which is available on the Parish Council website . Please check the calendar before requesting a booking.
