## READING ROOM UPDATE

"The project to extend and enhance the Reading Room is progressing and we shall shortly be in a position to submit a planning application to South Hams District Council.

We are currently arranging for a Heritage Statement and Impact Assessment to be prepared, as this needs to be included with the planning application.

Last year we had constructive discussions with South Hams planners in a Pre-Application process with the planners and we believe we can have some confidence that planning permission will be granted. We have also been able to satisfy the requirements of South West Water in relation to external drains pipework.

Prior to the planning application being formally submitted, it is our intention to have a display of the current plans and drawings both in digital format on the Parish website and in hard copy on display boards in the Reading Room after the pantomime. In addition we propose to invite regular user groups for focussed discussions with us to ensure that insofar as possible the current plans and drawings do meet the differing needs of the various regular users of the Reading Room. Arrangements for such discussions will be finalised shortly.

After planning permission has been obtained and anticipated building costs established, we shall then embark upon securing grant funding for the project.

We believe this to be a very exciting development of the Reading Room that will produce long-term benefits for our community.

## CHURCH NEWS

**Covid restrictions have changed recently** and the current rule (that may change again) is that we can attend church with the advisory to wear masks, please. Luckily we are still able to sing in a regular service with masks in place unless told otherwise (sparse attendance on a given morning when it may not be deemed a necessary precaution). The church will continue to be open daily for private prayer/visiting.

Our regular services of Morning Prayer are held each Sunday at 9:30 am except the third Sunday of each month when a service of Holy Communion takes place at 11:00 am.

We were very pleased to have been offered an extra service of Holy Communion at 9:30 am on January 9<sup>th</sup> with Rev. Steve Weston as celebrant. It was well attended and much appreciated by everyone. Thank you, Steve for being with us.

At the time of writing there is due to be a PCC meeting in the third week of January. As a result of Covid restraints, it looks as if it will take place via Zoom with Matt leading the proceedings from his home.

**Each year St James the Less Church gives 10% of its non-restricted income** (that is income which is not for a specific purpose, e.g. grants, donations etc) to charity. This is in addition to the monies collected from events such as the Harvest Supper, which went to the Shekinah Mission in Plymouth.

In 2021 we supported the Friends of Lamagaon, a Christian school in the Indian Himalayas, where, as well as the awful impact of the disease, people's livelihoods have been very badly affected by COVID. We also support Cancer Research, Crisis at Christmas and the Tear Fund. The latter is a charity which partners with churches in more than 50 of the world's poorest countries supporting sustainable developments, responding to disasters and challenging injustice.

The meeting will commence at 7.30pm. Public are welcome to join the Open Forum which is held at the beginning of each KPC meeting for any questions you may have. Any COVID-19 precautions still in force at the time will have to be strictly followed.

**Kingston Parish Clerk.** Lorraine Squire (Q) has now taken over from Sue Green as Parish Clerk. KPC would like to thank Sue for all her hard work in support of KPC and the village, and welcome Q who we are sure will do an equally great job.

**Winter Preparedness.** If needed, there are *grit supplies* in bins at certain strategic points in the village. However, please remember that the grit is supplied for the use on the *village highways only*. If it gets colder, Cllr. Merv Freeman will bring out the parish supplies of salt. If you should need to use this salt, the ratio is **ONLY 1 tablespoon per square metre**.

**Dogs.** Unfortunately, the amount of dog mess in the village is increasing. Please pick up after your dog and dispose of the bagged poo in an appropriate place – i.e. a suitable bin, and encourage others to do the same. Please also keep your dog under control and on a lead while in the village and also on both public and permissive footpaths through fields/agricultural land. Dogs allowed to run loose in fields where crops are growing may damage them. Fields can also contain livestock, even if you can't initially see it, and lambing season has now begun.

**Household Support Fund.** South Hams District Council's Household Support Fund is designed to provide rapid short-term financial support for residents who do not have enough money to buy essentials like food or pay for heating. Anyone over 16 could be eligible, but you will need to confirm that your need is genuine. For more information: <https://www.southhams.gov.uk/household-support>.

## Hiring Charges Kingston Reading Room



- Sessions are 8:30am to 1:30pm, 1:30pm to 6:30pm, 6:30pm to 11:30pm. If more time is needed to set up or clear away, then it should be booked.
- Hall users that satisfy the objects of the Reading Room charity Trust deed are charged at £6 per session. They must be non-profit (and may be subject to financial review) and open to all residents of Kingston Parish and be advertised in Kingston as such.
- Private events are charged at £7.50 per hour or part hour, including set up and clean up times.
- Sole occupancy of the Reading Room for a full day is charged at £275.
- Afternoon session children's parties are charged at a concessionary rate of £10 per session.
- The meeting room is charged at £5 per session.
- Existing agreements will be honoured.
- Bookings are recorded in the Reading Room bookings calendar which is available on the Parish Council website . Please check the calendar before requesting a booking.

### Meaning

The five church buildings which are linked together in the Modbury Mission Community are all buildings with varying sizes of spires. Over the many centuries some of these spires have been struck by lightning, repointed and rebuilt, hidden vicars on the run in the English Civil war and one of them hit by a Luftwaffe bomb.

At the moment the tower and spire at St Lawrence’s Church, Bigbury, are covered in scaffolding, as work is ongoing to make it watertight and re-hang the bells so they can once again ring out across the parish.

Last year someone showed me an original sea chart from around the late 17th century. The part of the map they showed me was the coast around Bigbury bay. And on this chart was marked St Lawrence’s spire, so seafarers on their boats in the Channel could mark where they were and safely make their way through the seas along this coast and onto their destination.

And in many ways that is what these church buildings represent. The church is a place for the community in the past, the community at the present and the community in the future, to help us make our way through this life in the company of God’s love and into eternity. At its best a church building is a place where the big questions of life can start to make sense.

Don’t you find that life can be utterly perplexing at times? Isn’t there a distinct scarcity in substantial, proven wisdom in this world – truth that makes life work, that cracks open the puzzle of the meaning of life and destroys the fear of death? Where would you look for that? Maybe the Christian church is the last place you’d look. Or maybe it’s the place to start to look.


