

Refuse and Recycling. Finally, brown bin collections will recommence at the beginning of April. For Kingston: if your waste and recycling are usually collected on a Wednesday, your first brown bin collection will be Wednesday 30th March; if your waste and recycling are usually collected on a Friday, your first brown bin collection will be: Friday 8th April.

Please also note that collection days will change due to the Easter and May bank holidays – these have not been published at time of writing but will be shared to KEG Facebook Page as soon as they are released.

Reduced Price Compost Bins. Recycle Devon has partnered with GetComposting.com to offer home compost bins at special prices for Devon residents. This includes an additional Buy One Get One Half Price offer on all Blackwell compost bins. Home compost bins can be ordered for the GetComposting website or by calling 0844 571 4444.

Dogs. Unfortunately, the amount of dog mess in the village is increasing again. Please pick up after your dog and dispose of the bagged poo in an appropriate place – i.e. a suitable bin, and encourage others to do the same. Please also keep your dog under control and on a lead while in the village, on any road or path shared with horse-riders and cyclists, in the churchyard and also on both public and permissive footpaths through fields/agricultural land. Dogs allowed to run loose in fields where crops are growing may

damage them. Fields can also contain livestock, even if you can't initially see it, and lambing season is underway.

Theft of Heating Oil. Devon & Cornwall Police are seeing an increase in Heating Oil theft and with fuel prices likely to remain high this is likely to continue. Sprees of oil theft tend to be preceded by an increase in door-to-door sales – an easy way for thieves to check out garden layouts and oil tank positions. Please be aware and call the police if you feel there is anything suspicious. Please also ensure that your oil tank is secure and not an easy target.

South Hams District Council Climate Emergency Planning Consultation. Under new planning policy and guidance, developers planning to build new homes or any development in the South Hams will have to incorporate measures to help owners tackle climate change as soon as they move in. To take part in the consultation, go to: <https://www.plymouth.gov.uk/planningandbuildingcontrol/planningpolicyandguidance/climateemergencyplanningpolicyandguidance>. This consultation closes on 21st April.

Devon Climate Emergency Partnership Consultation. Devon Climate Emergency Partnership are also running a consultation on their proposed response to last summer's Devon Climate Assembly, which includes recommendations for actions to be included in the Devon Carbon Plan. South Hams District Council are backing a low interest rate lending scheme to help homeowners with essential repairs and efficiency improvements. Step On Grant to help with Housing Crisis. South Hams District Council are launching a pilot scheme to help local people get on the housing ladder and boost the number of homes available at affordable rents. The Step On scheme will give up to £5,000 to anyone currently renting a social housing property to help them purchase a shared ownership home. Hiring Charges Kingston Reading Room



- Sessions are 8:30am to 1:30pm, 1:30pm to 6:30pm, 6:30pm to 11:30pm. If more time is needed to set up or clear away, then it should be booked.
- Hall users that satisfy the objects of the Reading Room charity Trust deed are charged at £6 per session. They must be non-profit (and may be subject to financial review) and open to all residents of Kingston Parish and be advertised in Kingston as such.
- Private events are charged at £7.50 per hour or part hour, including set up and clean up times.
- Sole occupancy of the Reading Room for a full day is charged at £275.
- Afternoon session children's parties are charged at a concessionary rate of £10 per session.
- The meeting room is charged at £5 per session.
- Existing agreements will be honoured.
- Bookings are recorded in the Reading Room bookings calendar which is available on the Parish Council website . Please check the calendar before requesting a booking.


