
YOUR SPEED

House Title Deeds

Erratum:- Sorry, folks — I managed to mislead the avid readers of last month's article about preserving the paper documents, the Title Deeds, which used to change hands on the sale of a house. In the text, I missed out the word "married". I should have stated that it was married women who did not have the full right to own property in 1872.

Although earlier Married Women's Property Acts were passed (especially one in 1870), it was not until a more detailed Act dated 1882 came into force that women, completely independently of their husbands, had full rights to be owners of houses etc. - just the same rights as single women had previously been allowed.

Just a reminder from last month. The archive team would be very interested in recording whatever information you can spare from any Title Deeds (particularly of the older properties in the village) because the fear is that these documents are more likely to be lost nowadays. This is because transfers are only recorded electronically now.

Catalytic converter thefts

Over the last couple of weeks Devon & Cornwall Police have noted an increase in thefts of catalytic converters from cars. These have occurred mainly in the Plymouth and Tavistock areas. The crimes tend to take place overnight or very early in the morning. Offenders will often jack up a car and use cutting tools to remove the catalytic converter from the car exhaust system. Whilst most modern cars have catalytic converters, it appears that older Japanese cars and hybrid vehicles are the most at risk.

The theft of catalytic converters is often linked to organised crime and can be costly for victims.

What do you need to do?

Members of the public should be vigilant in reporting any suspicious activity to the police, noting vehicle details and descriptions. Activity may include the sound of power tools being used and people acting suspiciously around vehicles. Notify the police using 999 if you suspect an offence is being committed.

How can you prevent this?

- Consider getting your catalytic converter uniquely marked so that it can be easily identified.
- Park your car in a well-lit and overlooked area.
- · Consider purchasing a locking device for your catalytic converter.
- Consider parking close to fences, walls or a kerb with the catalytic converter being closest to the fence, wall or kerb to make the theft more difficult.
- If you have any information regarding catalytic converter theft, please contact police via our website here or call 101 quoting CR/067361/22 or alternatively via Crimestoppers anonymously or 0800 555 111.
- Join Devon & Cornwall Alert, watch schemes and local social media groups so that you can find out what is happening in your area.






CHURCH NEWS

Hiring Charges Kingston Reading Room



- Sessions are 8:30am to 1:30pm, 1:30pm to 6:30pm,
 6:30pm to 11:30pm. If more time is needed to set up or clear away,
 then it should be booked.
- Hall users that satisfy the objects of the Reading Room charity Trust deed are charged at £6 per session. They must be nonprofit (and may be subject to financial review) and open to all residents of Kingston Parish and be advertised in Kingston as such.
 - Private events are charged at £7.50 per hour or part hour, including set up and clean up times.
 - Sole occupancy of the Reading Room for a full day is charged at £275.
 - Afternoon session children's parties are charged at a concessionary rate of £10 per session.
 - The meeting room is charged at £5 per session.
 - Existing agreements will be honoured.

For many people September is the month when the holidays are over, and life settles back into routine, the days are shorter, the nights cooler, the sun is less intense and autumn is not far away. But for others September feels like the start of a new year as children, young people, and teachers return to school facing new challenges, projects, skills and learning. From childhood we have been used to regarding September as the brink of something new and perhaps exciting; there may be a new school, new clothing, new books, new friends, as well as hopes expectations and aspirations. Although for some GCSE and A level students these may be tinged with trepidation and anxiety. Thinking of September as a time of new beginnings can bring a sense of anticipation, of new possibilities. Perhaps the rest period that summer holidays represent has enabled ideas about 'what's next' to develop and grow, and what before may have seemed impossible can suddenly seem possible. Maybe these include a new skill to be learned, a new hobby to start, a new group to join, a new fitness plan to put in action, which could lead to the opportunity of forging new friendships.

However, as we know, new beginnings are not reserved only for September. Yet in all that pain and suffering it can be comforting to realise that in Christ we are never alone. God loves and cares about us and invites us to lean on him, and if we read some of the Psalms we can see that we can go to God boldly and cry out to him because he tells us that we can.
