OBITUARY

Dr Judith (Judy) Mary Alloway (July 1945 – September 2022)

Judy passed away on September 7th and her death is a sad loss to us all.

Judy graduated with a first-class degree in microbiology, followed by three years of research for a PhD in fungal genetics at The University of Wales, Aberystwyth. She married Brian Alloway after completing her thesis and moved to London with him. After working in various part time teaching and research jobs, Judy embarked on a career in adult education guidance which culminated in her becoming Assistant Principal of Oaklands College of Further Education in Hertfordshire in 1993. On leaving Oaklands in 1997, she was involved in inspecting adult education courses at various colleges in Britain and overseas.

On retiring, Judy and Brian moved to Kingston from Hertfordshire in 2001 and Judy soon became involved in local projects including the village and neighbourhood plans and various grant applications to bodies like the National Lottery. She had a high success rate in these efforts and consulted to various national and local organisations who were applying for European Union Structural funds. Judy was pleased to make her contribution to life in Kingston and had confidence that others will now take up the challenge.

She was very proud of her family: Her husband Brian and their children Lara, Robert and David and relished spending time with her six grandchildren.

Her funeral and burial in the churchyard of St James the Less will be on Friday 30th September at mid-day, followed by a buffet in the Reading Room; all are welcome.



We welcome new residents who would like to join the History Society to come along to the AGM to find out more. Guy Walker



Our thoughts are with Brian and the family at this sad time.





Next Kingston Parish Council Meetings – Thursday 29th September and Thursday 20th

October in the Reading Room. Due to the period of national mourning following the death of HM Queen Elizabeth II, the parish council meeting originally scheduled for Thursday 15th September has been postponed to Thursday 29th September, downstairs in the Reading Room at 7.30pm. By the time this newsletter is published, the Agenda will have been placed on the Parish Website and (www.kingstonparishcouncil.co.uk) Parish the Noticeboard (situated on the Fire Station wall). October's meeting will go ahead as scheduled at 7.30pm in the Reading Room on Thursday 20th October, with the Agenda placed on the Parish Website and Noticeboard by Thursday 13th October. Public are welcome to join the Open Forum which is held at the beginning of each KPC meeting for any questions you may have.

Refuse and Recycling. As of Monday 3rd October, South Hams District Council will begin operating the waste and recycling service themselves due to the termination of FCC's contract. Initially, the service should be the same as currently planned; more detail will follow in November's newsletter and via the Kingston Events Group Facebook page. In the meantime, please continue to sort your waste and recycling as you do now, report missed collections and in particular also report any recurring problems to Cllr Suzannah Grant on sgrantkpc@gmail.com so she can provide SHDC with consolidated feedback from the village.

<u>Defibrillator Training</u>. Southwest Ambulance Services are giving free defibrillator training, open to all. Ash Die-Back. This continues to be a concern around the village. Landowners are responsible for keeping an eye on any trees on their land which impinges on footpaths and bridleways or which are near roads. If the tree is over 50% dead, branches may be shed and if they are large they could damage people or vehicles.

 - Afternoon session children's parties are charged at a concessionary rate of £10 per session.
 - The meeting room is charged at £5 per session.

Substitution

One of my predecessors at St Andrews, Aveton Gifford, was the Revd. Daniel Pitman. He was the vicar in the early years of the twentieth century. History records him as a snappy dresser (unlike the present incumbent!) he would be seen around the village in a black top hat and dark morning suit with tails and starched shirt and collar.

He was also the local magistrate and was known to pay the fines of villagers found guilty when he was sitting on the bench, rather than have the villagers go to prison for being unable to pay their fines.

In doing so he was modelling his boss, not the bishop but the Lord Jesus Christ, who is the head of the church. Jesus didn't put his hands in his pocket to pay a fine but stretched out his hands upon a cross to take upon himself as the judge his judgement for our sin. That substitution is at the heart of the Christian faith and available to all who come in faith to ask for it.
