


Janet Burton, Jo Gulliford and Rachel Bush are running the Plymouth 10k to raise money for Devon Air Ambulance on Sunday May 14th.

The spirit of that classic film, The Italian Job, is alive and well and living in Kingston as International Motor Sport returns to the village this month in the form of 'THE ITALIAN JOG'.

The 6th annual rally for pre-1990 cars sees entries from as far afield as Latvia, Germany, Scotland and Aveton Gifford, but it's the locals who will be hoping to keep the magnificent S.H.I.T.E trophy in the village.

Bill Mears, helped by Tina, will be giving his newly rebuilt Mini Clubman its first competitive outing. Bill has competed in all five of these annual rallies, as has Joe Freeman who will probably wait to find out which of his cars he can get going on the morning before deciding which one to take.

A host of other local entries include Phil & Joan Anderson (Land Rover), John & Susie Cullen (Triumph Stag), Tom & Kitty Hendy (BMW), Ash Collins (Vauxhall Victor), Steve Lovegrove (TR7), Jon Fish (undecided) and Shane Edgecombe (possibly). Add into the mix a Mini Cooper S, TR6, Alfa Romeo, MGB, Aston Martin DB6 and a Ford Fiesta and the Dolphin Inn car park will be a feast for the eyes of petrol-heads.

This year there is a separate start in Salisbury for a small contingent of regular crews from Wiltshire and all crews will meet up at the end of the first day in Saumur.

Ahead of the drivers is a gruelling 2000-mile rally to the Italian Lakes including some of finest mountain roads in Europe, several of which featured in the original film with Michael ("You're only supposed to blow the bloody doors off") Caine.

Mr Caine's role will be taken by Mr Denham who has suggested that this may be his last rally organised for the South Hams Independent Tour of Europe (in case you were wondering what the letters on the trophy stood for).

Over the years the village has hosted 'Monte Carlo or Rust', 'Finding Remo', 'Pamplona Run (no bull)', 'Craic Pot Challenge' and 'Pub Safari'.

"I'm running out of good roads......and patience" said Mr Caine. So step forward anyone who fancies the organiser's job...

The car and crews will be gathering for the start at the **Dolphin Inn from 6.00pm on Thursday May 25th**.

All the surviving crews and cars will be finishing back at the Dolphin at lunchtime on Thursday June 8th.

#### **Refuse and Recycling**

Both SHDC and KPC are aware of parishioners' continued frustration with our carefully segregated recycling being taken away, mixed, in the same truck. SHDC would like to reassure parishioners that it **can be and is** re-segregated at the depot (even when glass is broken). This form of collection also remains a temporary measure following the previous contractor's failure to deliver. SHDC currently plan to re-introduce a full segregated-at-kerbside recyling service, including the resumption of food waste collection, in the Autumn. Eight small-sized trucks, suitable for the narrow lanes and tight bends in Kingston and other similar parishes, are currently on order.

#### **Footpath Warden**

KPC are extremely grateful to the late John Wurr for his dedicated work as the parish Footpath Warden. A new volunteer for the post is now required – this will involve liaison primarily with Devon County Council, rather than the parish or South Hams District Council, and could be a job-share. Please contact the parish clerk if you are interested.

#### **New Transport Service for Kingston**

Kingston now has a bus on a Tuesday, departing Kingston Fire Station at 10.13am, calling at Modbury and Ermington, arriving Ivybridge Town Hall at 10.50am and Lee Mill Tesco at 11.00am. The return service departs from Lee Mill Tesco at 12.25, Ivybridge Town Hall at 12.35, Modbury Post Office at 12.55 and arrives back at Kingston Fire Station at 13.12. If you choose to stop in Ivybridge there is the opportunity for local shopping in Fore Street and Glanvilles Mill, the library, the Watermark centre and/or the leisure centre, plus a stroll by the River Erme and potentially time for a quick pint before catching the bus back.

There is also a new Fare Car service operating on a Friday. This is run by Ivy Cabs – you do need to phone on the Thursday between 8am and 5pm on 01752 895555 to book your seat. The cost is £3 (or £2 for pass holders). The Fare Care will get you to Modbury in time to catch the No. 3 bus service at 10.08am arriving in Plymouth at 10.53am. The return service departs Royal Parade at 13.00, arriving at Modbury at 13.45 where you will be collected by the Fare Car to return home. This service also provides another option of going to Ivybridge, arriving at 10.35 and departing at 13.15.

#### **Electric Vehicle Charging Points**

Electric vehicle charging is now available in Poundwell Car Park in Modbury. This service is being provided by Scottish Power. To use it you will need to download their App to pay and you will need to supply your own Type 2 lead. The 22 KW unit will charge a vehicle from 20% to 80% in circa 4 hours and, if it is between 8am and 6pm, you will also need to pay for parking (£2.90 for 4 hours or all day for £5).

#### Dog Poo

Unfortunately, the amount of dog mess in the village is increasing again. PLEASE PICK UP after your dog and dispose of the bagged poo in an appropriate place – i.e. a suitable bin, and not a bag "decorating" the hedgerow. Please also encourage others to do the same.

#### **Traffic Speed – Twenty is Plenty!**

There has been an increase in the number of cars travelling relatively fast through the village recently. Please keep your speed down in the village.

## **Kingston Reading Room Hall Hire charges 2023**



- Sessions are 8:30am to 1:30pm, 1:30pm to 6:30pm, 6:30pm to 11:30pm. If more time is needed to set up or clear away, then it must be booked.
- Commercial events are charged at £7.50 per hour or part hour, including set up and clean up times.
- The charge for sole occupancy of the Reading Room for a full day is by negotiation.
- Hall uses that satisfy the objects of the Reading Room charity trust deed are charged at a subsidised £10 per session. They must be non-profit (and may be subject to financial review) and open to all residents of Kingston Parish, be advertised in the Kingston Newsletter and on Kingston related social media (e.g. KEG Facebook page) as such and be approved by the Management Committee at least one month in advance of the first session.
- Private parties for Kingston Parish residents are charged at a concessionary rate of £10 per session.
- The downstairs meeting room is charged at £5 per session.
- Bookings are recorded in the Reading Room bookings calendar which is available on the Parish Council website. Please check the calendar before requesting a booking.


