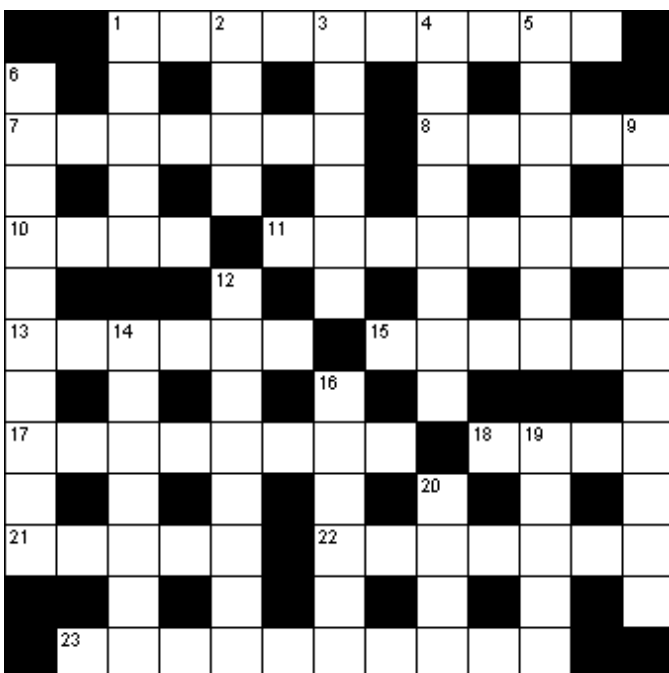

THE ITALIAN JOG

They're back! Fifteen classic cars, (plus a handful of more modern machines) set off across the Channel on May 25th and all but one returned safely after a 2,500 mile epic journey. Sadly, Carmen Mears and Rob Squire only made it a few hundred yards into France before Carmen was deported due to a passport problem. *"We've had a few differences of opinion with the local gendarmerie on previous events but this is the first time we've had someone being deported,"*

said rally organiser Denham proudly. Another victim was Ash Collins, landlord of the Pickwick Inn, whose Vauxhall expired just a couple of stages from the finish. He returned in a hire car and the Vauxhall is still making its way home on the back of a truck.

For most of the crews, it was a comparatively trouble-free run. The sun shone every day and, after a late heavy snowfall, the high mountain passes opened just a few days before our arrival. We even managed to tackle the infamous Stelvio Pass (9,300 feet) between Italy and Austria in the early morning before the hordes of cyclists, bikers and campervans arrived. Evening entertainment was provided by a festival and firework display in Dole, an oompah band gathering in Bludenz and just a glass or two of the local beverage everywhere else en route.

After 13 days of hard driving, the crews arrived back at the Dolphin exhausted but happy. John and Susie Cullen (Aveton Gifford) were outright winners in their Triumph Stag despite having managed to stop for lunch most days. Derek and Anna Patterson (Salisbury) came second in the TR6 with Kingston's own Jo Freeman and Jon Fish just climbing into third position in their well-travelled Peugeot... which also served as their accommodation for the trip!

Bill and Tina Mears came in fourth having nursed their Mini home and fed it with copious amounts of oil each day. Phil and Joan Anderson (Land Rover) won the touring class but could easily have won another prize for the constant smile on their faces. Nice to see people enjoying themselves.

That was the sixth annual S.H.I.T.E rally (South Hams International Tours of Europe) and Denham said it was going to be his last one as organiser. However, there are rumours that he is considering one more for luck! *Watch this space.*

Kingston Reading Room Hall Hire charges 2023



- Sessions are 8:30am to 1:30pm, 1:30pm to 6:30pm, 6:30pm to 11:30pm. If more time is needed to set up or clear away, then it must be booked.
- Commercial events are charged at £7.50 per hour or part hour, including set up and clean up times.
- The charge for sole occupancy of the Reading Room for a full day is by negotiation.
- Hall uses that satisfy the objects of the Reading Room charity trust deed are charged at a subsidised £10 per session. They must be non-profit (and may be subject to financial review) and open to all residents of Kingston Parish, be advertised in the Kingston Newsletter and on Kingston related social media (e.g. KEG Facebook page) as such and be approved by the Management Committee at least one month in advance of the first session.
- Private parties for Kingston Parish residents are charged at a concessionary rate of £10 per session.
- The downstairs meeting room is charged at £5 per session.
- Bookings are recorded in the Reading Room bookings calendar which is available on the Parish Council website. Please check the calendar before requesting a booking.

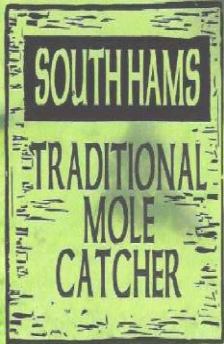
