The History Society has now concluded its summer programme of events and we did so by a really

interesting and enjoyable visit to Wonwell Court Farm on 6 July.

Our grateful thanks go to Eve White and her family for inviting us to see their home, which is one of the oldest houses in the area. We learned that there had been a settlement there since Saxon times and Eve took us through the history that she knew, and had further worked on with our archivists, to produce a fascinating chronological journey about changes to this grade 2 listed house through time to the present day.

We are enormously grateful to Eve. We are also very grateful to her son Paul who told us about the type of farming undertaken at Wonwell Court Farm and plans for the future, including robotised milking. I was delighted that Phil White was also able to add to the family story.

After the visit we returned to West View for afternoon tea and an opportunity to see the presentations of plans and photographs of Wonwell Court Farm and its immediate area that our archivists had carefully prepared and displayed for us.

READING ROOM DEVELOPMENT UPDATE

Breaking news! We are going to install WiFi in the Reading Room very shortly - prepare to see a step change for the better in what we can offer. Watch this space for updates.

What about the proposed extension and improvement of the Reading Room? Having obtained planning consent, expert professional advice and full costings (basically all the technical elements) the Management Committee is now moving to the next key stages of the project:

- The opportunity for everyone to see more, have your say and get involved
- How the project is to be funded?

In early September, it is planned to hold an open forum and provide the opportunity for everyone to get involved, have their say, and in that way taking the project forward in the direction that will best serve our needs. On the progress of the funding stage we have had the benefit of advice from several professional fund raising agencies in Devon and some of the committee have attended training sessions specifically focussed on how best to achieve success in funding applications. As a consequence, we now have a much clearer idea of what potential funders want to see and why this is so important. We will be happy to discuss this and other funding issues at the forum.

Overall the message is loud and clear - we must show that the proposed development will produce real benefits for the local community and that the building will provide for a wider range of activities that will be regularly used and enjoyed.

To improve our prospects on both fronts we need some fresh thinking on additional uses and benefits for our community. Your opinion matters - come and voice it!

To help us gather your ideas, and also gauge the level of support in the village for the project, we would like to survey everyone who lives in the village and those who have second homes here. If you are a member of the KEG Facebook Group you will shortly see a post relating to the project and asking for your contact details. Please respond so we can keep you informed directly, gather our data and keep as paperless as possible.

We are excited at this opportunity to extend and improve the Reading Room for the benefit of all and we hope that you are excited by this too.

Recreation Ground Skate Park

Unfortunately the skate park equipment in the recreation ground has reached the end of its life and will have to be removed. Sources of funding to replace it are being investigated. The skate park has been taped off as instructed by SHDC and people are asked to stay off the ramps in the meantime.

Ash Die-Back

Most people in our parisk will already have heard of Ash Die Back disease; this short run-down aims to provide a bit more information and explain why it matters to us here in Kingston.

What is Ash dieback?

Ash dieback is a highly destructive fungal disease affecting (you guessed it) Ash trees. First recorded in the UK in 2012, it has since become widespread across all regions. It causes leaf loss and canopy decline, resulting in deadwood formation and often death of the tree. The fungus is spread via

airborne spores, with estimates suggesting 80% of Ash trees will succumb to the disease over time.

Why is it important?

Ash trees are the third most common British tree, with 60 million estimated outside of woodlands. Ash provides a significant habitat and cultural value; the effects of the disease will have a major and costly impact on our natural environment, including Kingston's.

Identifying Ash dieback:

Ash dieback can affect all ages of Ash trees, but younger ones show symptoms faster. Overall, all affected trees will show these signs:

- Dieback of leaves and shoots, visible in summer
- Dark diamond shaped lesions where branches meet trunk
- New growth from dormant buds, called epicormic growth which is a stress response
- Canopy decline and lots of dead and brittle wood forms

Your Responsibilities:

Owners and managers of the land on which ash trees grow are responsible for managing the risk from trees. If your Ash tree or one of its branches falls on someone, says you may be liable. This is why diseased trees around the village are starting to be removed or worked on by local agencies and land managers – to manage and reduce risk. Although the risk to human safety is extremely low, tree owners nevertheless have a duty of care and as such need to consider management options for infected Ash trees on their land.

Management options:

There are a number of options for managing diseased trees, depending upon their location and the potential associated risk:

- Do nothing where there is no risk to safety
- Remove dead and diseased wood
- Pollard and top of the tree
- Fell or dismantle the tree

We are planning to fund 3 more large vans to take humanitarian aid in the next convoy on the 18th of September 2023, the 15th convoy since we all started in March 2022 with

CORNWALL & DEVON SENDING LOVE TO UKRAINE.

Although Putin's exploits have seemed to disappear from the headlines of most of our mainstream news providers recently, the pain and suffering caused by the bombs and missiles that continue to rain down on Ukrainian towns is still part of everyday life.

The aid that we deliver will not help everyone, but with your support, we can continue to bring some comfort and smiles to lots of faces. We have been overwhelmed by the support given on our previous trips by everybody in our local community and beyond. The gratitude of the Ukrainian refugees that we have met, and the generosity from donators of aid and provisions that we have collected and successfully delivered, has motivated us to go again.

'Cornwall and Devon sending love to Ukraine' https://sendinglovetoukraine.org/ are a group of volunteers that continues to grow. Our efforts have been supported by individuals and local businesses, organisations and charities who have given generous financial support. We collaborate closely with contacts on the Poland/Ukraine border to take targeted aid and supplies. They tell us what they need, and we try to deliver. Together, since March '22, we have organised 137 van loads of provisions and medical items and equipment. The aid is all from donations and is sorted, organised, and transported by volunteers. The expenses are also funded entirely by donations and the volunteers. Our vans will join with this next convoy in what we're hoping will be largest yet.

Commercial events are charged at £7.50 per hour or part hour, including set up and clean up times. The charge for sole occupancy of the Reading Room for a full day is by negotiation. Hall uses that satisfy the objects of the Reading Room charity trust deed are charged at a subsidised £10 per session. They must be non-profit (and may be subject to financial review) and open to all residents of Kingston Parish, be advertised in the Kingston Newsletter and on Kingston related social media (e.g. KEG Facebook page) as such and be approved by the Management Committee at least one month in advance of the first session. Private parties for Kingston Parish residents are charged at a concessionary rate of £10 per session. The downstairs meeting room is charged at £5 per session. If you would like a copy of the Bible for your summer reading list and beyond then please get in contact and I would be happy to hand one on.


