Kingston Reading Room Hall Hire charges 2023



- Sessions are 8:30am to 1:30pm, 1:30pm to 6:30pm, 6:30pm to 11:30pm. If more time is needed to set up or clear away, then it must be booked.
- Commercial events are charged at £7.50 per hour or part hour, including set up and clean up times.
- The charge for sole occupancy of the Reading Room for a full day is by negotiation.
- Hall uses that satisfy the objects of the Reading Room charity trust deed are charged at a subsidised £10 per session. They must be non-profit (and may be subject to financial review) and open to all residents of Kingston Parish, be advertised in the Kingston Newsletter and on Kingston related social media (e.g. KEG Facebook page) as such and be approved by the Management Committee at least one month in advance of the first session.
- Private parties for Kingston Parish residents are charged at a concessionary rate of £10 per session.
- The downstairs meeting room is charged at £5 per session.
- Bookings are recorded in the Reading Room bookings calendar which is available on the Parish Council website. Please check the calendar before requesting a booking.

REMEMBERING TO SAY 'THANK YOU'

September is the time when many churches throughout the country hold a service of Harvest Thanksgiving, to thank God for his goodness. The tradition of celebrating Harvest Festival, in the way that we know it today, was first introduced in 1843 by Revd. Robert Hawker of Morwenstow, at a time when this country was primarily rural. As most people made a living from their fields, this was an opportunity to give thanks for being able to have the absolute necessities of life, unlike today when we do not have to do without food if bad weather affects the crops, as we can obtain similar produce from abroad. This year there have been problems with the weather and the supply and cost of some items, but generally, we can thank God for the products of his creation and for the miracle that a fruit tree or bush or a vegetable plant has been able to grow from a small seed.

'Thank you' is one of the first words that we learn to say as children, and possibly one of the first words we forget to say as Christians. We attend Harvest Thanksgiving Services, Remembrance and Memorial Services and other Services where we say thank you to God for the work and lives of others, but how often do we personally say thank you to God for what he has done for us, or for those we have been praying for? Often our prayers are littered with the word 'please', but sparse on the word 'thank you' as we ask God for help or healing for ourselves and others. But when he answers our requests, how often do we remember to say 'thank you'? Are we like the nine of the ten lepers who had been healed by Jesus who were so overjoyed at no longer being outcasts of society, that they went straight away to get on with their lives again? Or are we like the other leper who was so overjoyed that he came back to thank Jesus for his healing?

There are many different ways of saying 'Thank You' to God, for his countless blessings and for listening to us when we pray. In our church services we use four different types of prayer – adoration, confession, thanksgiving and intercession - and each one is as important as the others, so maybe we could use that pattern for our own prayers too?
