

#### **Refuse and Recycling:**

<u>Forthcoming Changes to the Refuse & Recycling Service</u>: SHDC now anticipate rolling out the full kerbside service to Kingston within the next few weeks – although exact date is still to be confirmed.

<u>Container Deliveries</u>: For those parishioners who have still been using the clear and blue recycling sacks, you should now have received your new containers comprising: 2x recycling boxes with lids; a white recycling sack; a kerbside food waste caddy; a smaller food waste caddy for your kitchen and an information pack explaining how to use it all. If you have not received your containers, please order them at: <a href="https://waste.southhams.gov.uk/containerorder">https://waste.southhams.gov.uk/containerorder</a>.

<u>Food Waste Caddies:</u> For all parishioners who did receive their new containers in 2021, SHDC understand that you may have misplaced or re-purposed them. If you now need new food caddies ahead of the full kerbside service starting, please order them at: https://waste.southhams.gov.uk/containerorder.

If you need assistance or have any problems with the waste and recycling services, please contact Cllr Suzannah Grant on sgrantkpc@gmail.com or 01548 810013.

SHDC Consultation – Public Space Protection Orders (PSPO) Dog Control: SHDC are consulting on reviewing their Dog Control PSPOs. PSPOs can be used to deal with a particular nuisance or problem in a specific area that is having a detrimental effect on the local community's quality of life, by imposing conditions on the use of that area which will apply to everyone. Fixed penalty notices up to £100 can be issued to those who do not follow the Orders. The current PSPOs are due to expire in March 2024 and thus SHDC are consulting to see whether the current ones should be extended or any additional areas should be included. Offences SHDC are currently looking to extend are: failure to pick up after a dog (dog fouling); requiring dogs to be on leads and dog exclusion areas. The consultation is open until 14<sup>th</sup> November and anyone can give their views. It can be accessed via: https://shdc-dogcontrol.commonplace.is/

**Saving Energy:** Devon Communities Together (DCT) are offering 1-2-1 advice on saving energy and mitigating the impact of energy costs. This includes: how to acceess financial or wellbeing support; understanding fuel poverty; the energy marget and energy costs; how to use energy effectively in the home; keeping warm; supplier services for vulnerable customers; smart meters; Devon oil collective and green energy. # **Kingston Reading Room Hall Hire charges 2023**



- Sessions are 8:30am to 1:30pm, 1:30pm to 6:30pm, 6:30pm to 11:30pm. If more time is needed to set up or clear away, then it must be booked.
- Commercial events are charged at £7.50 per hour or part hour, including set up and clean up times.
- The charge for sole occupancy of the Reading Room for a full day is by negotiation.
- Hall uses that satisfy the objects of the Reading Room charity trust deed are charged at a subsidised £10 per session. They must be non-profit (and may be subject to financial review) and open to all residents of Kingston Parish, be advertised in the Kingston Newsletter and on Kingston related social media (e.g. KEG Facebook page) as such and be approved by the Management Committee at least one month in advance of the first session.
- Private parties for Kingston Parish residents are charged at a concessionary rate of £10 per session.
- The downstairs meeting room is charged at £5 per session.
- Bookings are recorded in the Reading Room bookings calendar which is available on the Parish Council website. Please check the calendar before requesting a booking.

#### **SAVE OUR PARISH CHURCHES**

On October 1st Sir James Burnell-Nugent spoke at our church service to emphasise the importance of saving our rural parish churches. The following is a note provided by him to explain the present situation.

#### Does the Nation Need to 'Save The Parish'?

A national campaign was founded in 2021 by Father Marcus Walker when it was recognised the Church of England was determinedly reducing clergy and other resources from parishes, especially small or rural ones. The purpose of the campaign is to persuade leaders in the Church of England that its greatest treasure is the parish system and it needs the necessary resources to flourish. You might be shocked that this campaign is necessary at all! The campaign is being fought through all forms of media, in the General Synod of the Church of England, at grass roots level in hundreds of parishes, and in Parliament.

#### Why is a campaign needed?

The essence of Anglicanism is best summarised in John 10:14 "I am the good shepherd; I know my sheep and my sheep know me." This is the parish system – the shepherd (or priest) living amongst the sheep (parishioners) and them knowing each other. The priest exercises pastoral care and church leadership. The other key feature of the Anglican Church and its parishes is place. The vicar is the vicar of a place. People live in that place and go to church in that place. They may move, but they are baptised, married and have a funeral in a place (as of a right). Jesus told parables, performed miracles, was born and crucified in places that are known to us – Bethlehem, the Sea of Galilee and Jerusalem. The parish is a place, a parson and the people. All inextricably linked.

Several dioceses wish to cast this aside and move to a new model of so called Oversight Ministry. An oversight minister is more akin to an area manager. Or to stick with the sheep analogy – more like a farm manager than a shepherd. The first oversight minister in Truro Diocese covers the whole Lizard Peninsula of 23 parishes. She has only one ordained assistant priest, who operates outside the parish system and does not work at weekends! A similar programme is being rolled out in Leicester Diocese, where they were promised 2-3 clergy for every 12 parishes in Minster Communities. The first one has been announced and has 33 churches with just one priest. At least 6 other dioceses are following suit.

The main reason we are given for why dioceses are doing this is because of a lack of money to pay clergy. Well, they seem to have plenty of money to pay people in head office! In Truro Diocese there is one person behind a desk for every 2 vicars and yet clergy have been cut from 84 to 50 in recent years. In Leicester Diocese there are over 150 people in 'head office'.

We have a fight on our hands to save the proven 1000 year old parish system and its churches. There is a clear sequence to their plans – lose your vicar – lose your congregation – lose donations - lose your PCC – lose your church. Please don't fall for it.

#### 'We will remember them'

November is the month for remembrance, as we remember on the 5<sup>th</sup> Bonfire Night and on the second Sunday Remembrance Sunday.

Before I was a vicar, I was a history teacher in a secondary school just outside of Bristol. The best lessons happened when the past became something that could be experienced in the moment. I remember one pupil bringing in a shell case from WW1 that a French farmer had dug up while ploughing his fields just as they were walking by. In that lesson we were able to handle not just history books but actual history.

I took a group of A Level students to Berlin while they were studying the holocaust and we walked around a villa in the Berlin suburb of Wannsee where many historians believe the Final Solution was planned at a conference in 1941. The past became very close standing in the same rooms where those terrible decisions had been made.

The events that Christianity is founded upon can seem very distant. Yet what makes those events so powerful is that they can be experienced in the moment. What is that experience? A joyful expectation of the future based on true events of the past which changes everything about my present. It is a hope worth exploring.


