
Debbie Shotter has joined the Committee as from the AGM in October. Information on the current Committee members can also be found on the website - https://kingstonlocalhistory.co.uk

READING ROOM LICENCE APPLICATION

The Reading Room currently has a premises licence, which allows:

- The performance of live music.
- Playing of recorded music indoors.
- Performance of dance indoors.
- Provision of facilities for making music indoors.
- Provision of facilities for dancing indoors.

The committee is applying to amend this premises licence to allow the sale and consumption of alcohol so that organisations and caterers who wish to sell alcohol for consumption within the hall can do so without applying for a Temporary Event Licence (TEN).

In no way is it planned to set up the Reading Room in competition with the Dolphin Inn.

We hope that the residents of Kingston will support this application, which can be done as set out in the notice attached below.

LICENSING ACT 2003 FULL VARIATION

We, Kingston Reading Room Management Committee do hereby give notice that on 22nd November, 2023 we applied to the Licensing Authority at South Hams District Council for a new Premises Licence at Kingston Reading Room, Kingston, Kingsbridge, Devon, TQ7 4QE known as Kingston Reading Room (registered charity number 300882).

The application is for: The amendment of premises licence number CP0021 to allow the sale and consumption of alcohol in the Reading Room between the hours of 8am and 11pm. Also for the mandatory alcohol condition under the Licensing Act 2003 requiring a Designated Premises Supervisor in respect of a premises licence to be disapplied.

Any person wishing to make representations to this application may do so in writing to The Licensing Manager, South Hams District Council, Follaton House, Plymouth Road, Totnes, TQ9 5NE. (licensing@swdevon.gov.uk).

Representations must be received NO LATER than 20th December, 2023.

A copy of the application can be viewed at the Licensing Authority's address during normal office hours.

It is an offence knowingly or recklessly to make a false statement in connection with this application, the maximum fine on summary conviction being £5000.

READING ROOM CONSULATION UPDATE

The data from the recent survey has now been crunched and analysed.

We had 80 responses to the survey which is about 25% of the parish. A good result. Not surprisingly the Reading Room (RR) is considered to be extremely important to everyone without reservation and this was strong across all age groups and on both a personal and community level.

Not surprisingly, the more frequent the use, the greater the importance attached to the RR, although even infrequent and occasional users still value the facility.

It is clear from the survey that there is scope for further activities and we need to address usage by the younger age groups including children.

We also now have a clearer picture of what we expect out of the RR and your priorities in terms of what the project should focus on with its development and we have taken note of how you would prefer the work to be done with a minimum of closures.

Knowing these views and opinions and being able to state them with confidence is vital to our funding efforts and makes our funding applications stronger, so thank you one and all!

Work is now underway to move forward with the Reading Room project.

To set expectations, applying for funding and achieving it is **a long process**, so don't expect anything significant in terms of major renovation anytime soon!

However, meetings have taken place with our team of building experts to scope out and determine the best way forward, and with the team responsible for funding to work out the best approach to have the greatest possible chance of winning funds for the renovation. Both these meetings were based on the information you kindly supplied us in the survey. We are very lucky that we have very talented and experienced villagers who have volunteered their time to help us achieve your goals for the Reading Room.

These volunteers fall into two groups, those who are willing to help with the project and then another group who have put forward suggestions for new activities in the Reading Room. Our intention is to meet with both groups in the next couple of months. For those of you who volunteered to help with the refurbishment project, members of the committee will be in touch with you over the next couple of weeks to invite you to an initial meeting on 5th **December** at Pounds Farm so we can work out how best we can utilise your skills.

In the New Year, we would like to meet with the people who suggested and said they would help with activities to see how we can make these work and how we can bring these to life for the village.

So, there's lots going on in the background. We will keep you up to date on progress and of any significant events that happen. But once again we are grateful to you all for your support and enthusiasm.

Next Kingston Parish Council Meeting: Thursday 11th January 2024 in the Reading Room. The next Parish Council meeting will take place in the Reading Room at 7.30pm on Thursday 11th January – please note that in January the Parish Council meeting is being held on the second Thursday of the month as opposed to the third, to de-conflict from the pantomime. The Agenda will be placed on the Parish Website no later than 4th January. Public are welcome to join the Open Forum which is held at the beginning of each KPC meeting for any questions you may have.

Refuse and Recycling: By the time you read this, the new full kerbside service should be being rolled out to Kingston – the first week is the week commencing Monday 20th November. We no longer have a split round and, unless the letter from SHDC advised you differently, collection day for non-recyclable waste and all recyclable waste is Thursday. Brown bins – for those who pay for this service – will contine to be collected on Wednesday. For those parishioners who have still been using the clear and blue recycling sacks, these will now no longer be collected. You should now have received your new containers comprising: 2x recycling boxes with lids; a white recycling sack; a kerbside food waste caddy; a smaller food waste caddy for your kitchen and an information pack explaining how to use it all. If you have not received your containers (or if at any point you need a replacement), please order them at: https://waste.southhams.gov.uk/containerorder. All recycling put out must now be placed in the containers and will not be taken if it does not fit. If you need assistance or have any problems with the waste and recycling services, please contact waste-escalation@swdevon.gov.uk and/or Cllr Suzannah Grant on sgrantkpc@gmail.com or 01548 810013.

Bus Service: Unfortunately, due to low take-up, the revised 875 bus service on Tuesdays has been stopped. In its place, the Fare Car currently running on Fridays is now also running on Tuesdays, as follows:

Modbury Road Closures (Sewer Works): Various roads in Modbury will be closed for much-needed sewerage

upgrade works for approx. 6 weeks from 8th January 2024, currently planned as follows:

Broad Street: lane closure and traffic lights for 2 weeks from 8th January;

Church Street: road closed for 5 weeks from 8th January;

Moon Lane/Church Lane: road closed for 5 days from 12th February:

New Road: road closed overnight on 19th/20th January;

Poundwell Street: road closed overnight for 1 week from 8th January and again from 29th January.

<u>Winter Preparedness:</u> So far this autumn/winter we have not had snow, heavy frost or ice on the roads. Nevertheless, as December arrives, there are *grit supplies* in bins at certain strategic points in the village. However, please remember that the grit is supplied for the use on the *village highways only*. If it gets colder, Cllr. Merv Freeman will bring out the parish supplies of salt. If you should need to use this salt the ratio is ONLY *1 tablespoon per square metre*.

DAFFODIL HOUSE APPEAL

Once again we are organising an appeal at Christmas for Daffodil House, the Women's Refuge in Plymouth. Baby muslin cloths

Soft, sensory books for babies

Chocolates, biscuits and toiletries for the Mums

GOD SPEAKS

I write this on a day that my children did not go to school due to strong winds and rain. I would not be a proper British man if I did not mention the weather frequently. There was a season in my life when I would have excitedly headed out into the storm to windsurf on a day like today, excited for the power of the wind and waves, looking for huge jumps and fast turns. I find the weather and the waves amazing. As I stood on Challaborough beach early this morning, the sea was angry, roiling and boiling, bursting onto the rocks flinging spray and foam across the bay. It roared and misbehaved, slopping onto the road leaving flotsam and sand.

The raw power of the ocean must be respected despite the mainstream media's bewildering naming and personifying attempts to make it a scapegoat. There is a humility from us that the sea demands. The poet Wendell Berry writes; 'the dark of the sea is perfect and strange, the absence of any place, immensity on the loose.' ("The Farmer and the Sea" in The Peace of Wild Things).

For all its wonder, mystery and power the sea still knows the voice of it Maker. The Maker whose voice uttered serenity as He and his disciples were nearly overcome by a storm as they sailed (Mark 4:35-41). This particular episode ends with the disciples terrified asking one another 'who is this!?' Or rather 'what kind of man is this!?' (v41) He is the one with more power in his voice than even the wind and the waves: 'The voice of the Lord is over the waters; the God of glory thunders, the Lord thunders over the mighty waters. The voice of the Lord is majestic.' (Psalm 29:3-4)

For those he loves, he utters peace over all that is uncontrollable and chaotic, threatens destruction and overwhelms. He desires to speak to you if you are willing to listen?





What is Fare Car?

Fare Car is a public transport service operated by Private Hire cars. Passengers book and pay separately but share the advertised timetabled journeys. Fare Car is not a subsidised individual taxi service for people to use whenever and wherever they wish.

Who can use Fare Car?

Fare Car is available to passengers of all ages, regardless of whether or not they live in the area where it operates.

How do I use Fare Car?

To use Fare Car you need to book in advance with the Private Hire company, normally with 24 hours notice. It has fixed arrival/ departure times and points in town but runs door-to-door in rural areas.

Where can I travel to?

Each scheme covers a designated rural area and serves specific points in town e.g. supermarket, hospital, leisure centre.
