



**Garden waste collections will be suspended for 4 weeks** from Sunday 17<sup>th</sup> December (Wednesday 20<sup>th</sup> December in Kingston), resuming on Monday 17<sup>th</sup> January (Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup> January in Kingston).

You can/cannot recycle Christmas items as follows:

#### Can Recycle: Cannot Recycle: • Cards and crackers with no glitter, stuck on bits or shiny bits Cards and crackers with glitter, stuck on bits or shiny bits • Foil trays (please scrape off grease and rinse) and foil Plastic lined foil – place in grey bin wrappers (please scrunch into a ball) Crisp packets, sweet wrappers and film wrappers – place Brown paper in grey bin Cardboard packaging – but please ensure it is less than 75cm All other wrapping paper and sticky tape – place in grey long, if longer pelase take to one of our local recycling centres (Torr Quarry or Ivybridge) • Real Christmas trees – please take these to our local Plastic trays recycling centres (Torr Quarry or lvybridge) • Turkey, chicken and meat carcasses, cooked and uncooked Bubble wrap and polystyrene food waste. Fruit and vegetable peelings, nutshells and fruit Corks (both natural and plastic) Tinsel and damaged baubles Broken fairy lights – but please take to the local recycling

Help with Energy Costs for Lower Income Households: SHDC have been awarded £1.8M of funding to support lower income households through upgrading current heating systems and insulation. Any households in the village who have a combined gross income of less than £31,000 per year, are living in a property with an Energy Performance (EPG) grade of D-G and are not heated from the gas grid may be elgible for a Home Upgrade Grant (HUG2) to enable improvements designed specifically for each property's needs. This includes privately rented properties, for which landlords could receive up to 2/3 of the cost of improvements where the properties and the tenants are both eligible.

<u>Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB) renaming as National Landscape:</u> All AONBs across England (including the South Hams) were re-named as National Landscapes on 22<sup>nd</sup> November. An article outlining what this change means will follow in February's newsletter.

**<u>Bus Service:</u>** Unfortunately, due to low take-up, the revised 875 bus service on Tuesdays has been stopped. In its place, the Fare Car currently running on Fridays is now also running on Tuesdays, as follows:

#### Modbury

Arrival in Modbury at 1005 to connect with Bus Number 3 to Plymouth, departing at 1006

Departure from Modbury at 1345 to connect with Bus Number 3 from Plymouth, departing Plymouth Royal Parade at 1300

#### **Ivybridge**

Arrival in Ivybridge (Leisure Centre/Co-op) and Station at 1035

Departure from Ivybridge at 1315

#### **Tesco Lee Mill**

Arrival at Lee Mill Tesco 1045

Departure from Lee Mill Tesco 1305

To use the service you must book your journey at least 1 working day in advance with Ivy Cabs on 01752 895555; please call between 8am and 5pm. You will be given an approximate pick-up time – please be ready as this is a shared service. National bus pass holders travel free. Otherwise, fares are:

To/from Modbury: £2.00 single, £3.00 return (£1.40 single or £2.00 return for children 5 and over, under 5s travel free). To/from lyybridge or Lee Mill: £2.30 single, £3.50 return (£1.60 single or £2.30 return for children 5 and over, under 5s travel free).

<u>Modbury Road Closures (Sewer Works):</u> Various roads in Modbury will be closed for much-needed sewerage upgrade works for approx. 6 weeks from 8<sup>th</sup> January 2024, currently planned as follows:

Broad Street: lane closure and traffic lights for 2 weeks from 8<sup>th</sup> January;

Church Street: road closed for 5 weeks from 8<sup>th</sup> January;

Moon Lane/Church Lane: road closed for 5 days from 12<sup>th</sup> February:

New Road: road closed overnight on 19<sup>th</sup>/20<sup>th</sup> January;

Poundwell Street: road closed overnight for 1 week from 8<sup>th</sup> January and again from 29<sup>th</sup> January.

**Mobile Library Service:** Unfortunately, Devon County Council will be ceasing the Mobile Library service (currently 11.00-11.30 on the 4<sup>th</sup> Tuesday of each month for Kingston) at the end of February 2024.

**Winter Preparedness:** Now December is here, there are *grit supplies* in bins at certain strategic points in the village. However, please remember that the grit is supplied for the use on the *village highways only*. If it gets colder, Cllr. Merv Freeman will bring out the parish supplies of salt. If you should need to use this salt the ratio is ONLY *1 tablespoon per square metre*.

# **Kingston Reading Room Hall Hire charges 2023**



- Sessions are 8:30am to 1:30pm, 1:30pm to 6:30pm, 6:30pm to 11:30pm. If more time is needed to set up or clear away, then it must be booked.
- Commercial events are charged at £7.50 (£8 from 1 February 2024) per hour or part hour, including set up and clean up times.
- The charge for sole occupancy of the Reading Room for a full day is by negotiation.
- Hall uses that satisfy the objectives of the Reading Room charity trust deed are charged at a
  subsidised £10 per session. They must be non-profit (and may be subject to financial review), open to
  all residents of Kingston Parish, be advertised in the Kingston Newsletter and on Kingston related
  social media (e.g. KEG Facebook page) as such and be approved by the Management Committee at
  least one month in advance of the first session.
- Private parties for Kingston Parish residents are charged at a concessionary rate of £10 per session.
- The downstairs meeting room is charged at £5 per session.
- Bookings are recorded in the Reading Room bookings calendar which is available on the Parish Council website. Please check the calendar before requesting a booking.


