Joel Wakeling playing field / trees.

Finaly Sara Banham (taking Heather Summer Nutting's place when she had to resign for health reasons)- Reading Rooms /allotments.

Our very able Parish Clerk, Lorraine Squire, deals with the day to day running of the council answering questions, emails, phone calls, finding out information for us etc. etc. and generally keeping us on the straight and narrow. The Clerk is also our Responsible Financial Officer having to deal with the accounts and making sure everything satisfies the auditor.

We could not to do such a successful job without the support and help of our Devon County Councillor Rufus Gilbert and South Hams District Councillor Bernard Taylor who keep use up to date with Devon County and South Hams Councils news and information, advising and answering questions. They both generously supply us with small grants which we were able to use for things like the Recreation Grounds and defibrillator.

Neighbourhood Plan

This is working well but will be reviewed in 2025.

Recycling

Suzannah liaises with South Hams about the new inhouse recycling system introduced by SHDC last year. This seems to far more successful than the previous one but if you still have problems with this service, please, do not hesitate to contact Suzannah or the SHDC website where you can find out things like collections days and items you are allowed to include in your recycling and black bins.

Planning Applications

There have been 14 planning applications and 3 appeals in the past 12 months, 1 planning and 2 appeals still waiting to be decided, there is a new portal on the SHDC website which has made searching easier (just type the property name) and provides a little bit more detail. Overall we have been satisfied with the decisions made by the planning team.

Please be aware that although we are asked to comment on planning applications ultimately in is SHDC that make the decisions.

Highways

This winter it seems that it is either pouring with rain or blowing a gale or both! This inevitably results in large puddles, floods and the new sport of dodging potholes! Ideally repairs should be done in dry weather but some of the holes are so bad they can't wait also other utilities need to do their thing, so we are seeing a rash of roadworks being done just now. Please be patient because the sooner it is done the better the roads will be.

A big thank you to all the residents that took the trouble to clear any blocked drains as this headed off any potential flooding.

Footpaths

We have 10 footpaths including the coastal path, two permissive ones and a bridleway, all are of varying degrees of difficulty. These

are monitored and are frequently walked by everyone. Any repairs or maintenance problems are reported to Devon County Council. Newsletter

Financial Report 2022/23 The monies we receive are mostly from our portion of the Council Tax, which is added to with various grants from DCC. SHDC and other fund-raising events. Although the total may seem a lot, we have many financial commitments including the maintenance of the playing field.

As I said before the clerk is also our Responsible Finance Officer and she keeps a close eye on our spending.

The government rules that local Councils need only use the Internal Auditor if there is less than £25.000.00 turnover. As KPC's 2023/24 accounts closed on 31st March 2024 with less than a £25,000.00 the External Auditors, PKF Littlejohn require only the proof of Exemption Certificate.

For Openness and Transparency, the Council Accounts will be placed on the Kingston Parish Council Web Site for inspection.
